

## Entrusted scores upset in \$100,000 Swifty Sired Stakes at Indiana Grand Racing & Casino

When the field came out of the turn, it was all up to Entrusted and Polarizing, two longshots of the race, to fend off the rest of the field, and they both did just that. In the final strides it came down to the two fillies with Entrusted getting the edge late in the race to pull away to a three and one-half length victory over Polarizing, who held her ground along the rail. SHELBYVILLE, Ind.; - May 23, 2018 - Having a great brood mare in one's possession can be a great thing. The mare, Mor Trust just got a little more valuable to breeders Mike and Penny Lauer as her latest protégé, Entrusted, rallied home to a surprise win in the \$100,000 Swifty Sired Fillies Stakes Wednesday, May 23 at Indiana Grand.

Starting from post seven in the 10-Indiana sired filly lineup, Entrusted and jockey Marcelino Pedroza were one of the first names mentioned by Announcer Bill Downes as the duo moved into an early lead. Polarizing and Fernando De La Cruz held their ground on the inside and set the pace with Entrusted sitting to their outside. Ideal Sky and Jesus Castanon were able to find just enough room to squeeze through on the inside and get into position as the field moved into the turn.




